Our Vision

Chicago Public Schools will lead the U.S. in innovative educational practices by leveraging personalized learning to dramatically advance student outcomes and support our vision of rigorous, powerful instruction for every student.

Our Strategy

Our approach will reach 150 schools by the end of 2021. The strategy to accelerate the adoption of personalized learning is three fold: spark school interest, sponsor cohorts of schools, and foster collaboration. In order to support schools as interest grows, the district will focus its work on four key levers and create three entry points for schools.

Build and sustain external partnerships to provide resources to schools

Program Overview

The goal: Empower students to take ownership of their learning through personalized, student-led, and authentic learning opportunities

Cohort receives a high level of support from central office and external partners

Cohort schools drive transformational change for students and become exemplars of personalized learning throughout Chicago and nationwide

School-level Investments by CPS

Intensive professional development provided by PD vendor, LEAP Innovations

Teacher time costs (substitutes and extended day for Saturday PDs)

PL Instructional Leader and PL Social Emotional Learning Specialist to provide weekly, in-school support and coaching (for both teachers and school leaders) focused on instruction and culture

Technology (devices), as needed, to achieve target device-student ratios

Ed tech programs and instructional materials, as needed

Classroom redesign: Flexible learning environment enhancements, such as new furniture and classroom visual improvements
